

1. Did you have any nicknames growing up? Why did they stick? What would you do if you went hiking and saw a burning bush?
2. Read Exodus 3. Looking back at this week's teaching, and after reading this passage, was there anything that caught our attention, challenges or confused you? Anything you hoped we could talk about?
3. God has a name: Yahweh. In Hebrew, Yahweh sounds very similar to the verb: "I AM" or "I WILL BE." Jesus himself uses the same "I AM" language often in the Gospel of John. Read through some or all of the seven statements Jesus makes about himself. John 6:35, 8:12, 10:7, 10:11, 11:25, 14:6, 15:1. Which "I am" statement most caught your eye?
4. Read John 8:56-59. Now knowing what we know about God's name from Exodus 3, what is Jesus saying about himself to the religious leaders in this passage? Why do they try and kill him?
5. In Exodus 3:5, from the burning bush, God tells Moses to take off his sandals. And Moses hides his face from God in fear. Why do you think Moses had this response? See similar responses in Isa 6:1-5, Ezek 1:28, Rev 1:16-17.
6. All throughout the Bible, God is called "Holy." In your own words, what does the word "holiness" mean? Read Leviticus 11:45. How do we imitate God in this area?
7. Read Isa 66:2, 2 Tim 3:16. God revealed himself to Moses audibly through the burning bush. Today, he primarily uses the Bible to speak to us. What does it mean to "tremble" at God's word? How might our posture, perspective, or attitude change in our approach to the Bible?
8. Moses had many isolated encounters with God, but we can meet with him every day! Do you have a consistent time of prayer and Bible reading every day? If not, how can we as a group help you to make your next step in this area?
