

1. Describe an instance when you knew you were wrong but didn't want to admit it. OR...
2. Some people eat locusts. What is the most unusual thing you have eaten?
3. Read Chapters 10 & 11. Does anything stand out to you from the passage or the sermon that is thought provoking, interesting or challenging?
4. Read Deuteronomy 7:17-18, I Chronicles 16:12, & I Corinthians 11:24-25. Why is it so important to remember what God has done?
5. What does it say about the God whom we worship that he wants us to *know* him?
6. What do you think the reasons are that Pharaoh kept refusing to let the Israelites go? How can we avoid letting money, fear, pride or hatred ever play a role in our own stubbornness?
7. Re-read Exodus 10:17-20. This is the fourth time Pharaoh has prayed to God (via Moses as intercessor) for a plague to be removed, and the fourth time that he has failed to acknowledge God once the pressure of the plague has been lifted. Why would Pharaoh not acknowledge that God has answered his prayers? Compare this with the thankful leper (Luke 17:11-19). Are we ever guilty of not acknowledging or thanking God for answered prayers?
8. What do you think is the significance of darkness being the 9th plague?
9. Is it fair that God took the firstborn son of everyone – including the “son of the female slave”?
10. Pharaoh did not want to get off the throne and acknowledge there was someone greater than himself. We fight the same battle every day: we want to be King. What things, personally, make you want to stay on the throne?
